



IJS COMPETITIVE TEST PASSES FROM 1ST JULY 2011

The scores required to achieve IJS Competitive test passes have recently been reviewed, taking into account all changes since the last season and the increased ability and competency of skaters to achieve higher levels than when first introduced.

All elements selected to form the score were based on a Grade of Execution at BASE VALUE ONLY, thereby easily allowing skaters opportunity to increase scores by performing elements to a higher standard. It is based on the easiest option to meet the required elements in most cases, again allowing skaters opportunity to increase their scores.

The scales of values used in the calculations are as per the ISU regulations. This therefore means that any jump called as under-rotated in the singles and pairs events will receive 70% of the higher value jump, as opposed to 100% of the lower value jump in previous years.

ACHIEVING TEST SCORES

Test pass scores are achievable **only at the level at which the skater competes.**

Competitive Test passes are achievable at all NISA run events within the UK.

Scores awarded at recognised Internationals/Club Internationals/Championships are acceptable for accreditation at the corresponding level. This is subject to meeting the technical score if the event is not within the UK, and the score must be obtained from an event with no variation in the factors, rules or any part of the system. Panels must consist of a minimum of 3 judges and a separate Referee and 3 technical officials as per the ISU rules. The panels must also consist of a majority of ISU/International or NISA N1 officials. No variations are acceptable.

Other NISA permitted events in the UK such as IJS Opens, Home Country events and NISA permitted Internationals are subject to the requirements and panels as listed above.

Any skater wishing to apply for a test pass from a test taken abroad should attain TES per each individual segment when the total segment pass is attained from the overall competition score. Skaters may apply for either 1 or 2 passes as appropriate if the technical element score (TES) is obtained in the segment.
