RULES & REGULATIONS

1. The competition is confined to eligible skaters as defined by the National Ice Skating Association and will be held under NISA regulations and permit. Current NISA membership is mandatory. Please **DO NOT** send entry without a NISA number.
2. Test and age requirements are as closing date unless otherwise stated. If test standards change prior to the closing date, notification to the competition organiser is required immediately. "Test Pending" can not be accepted.
3. Unless entry forms are fully completed they will be returned to the sender for completion and resubmission before the closing date. Only **written** entries will be accepted complete with cheques.
4. Entry fees are as detailed on the entry form. Entry fees will not be refunded after the closing date.
5. Only entries with Licensed Coaches who have attended a field move seminar will be accepted.
6. In the event of oversubscription, entries will be treated on a strictly **first received** basis.
7. In competitions where only 1 competitor has entered, the referee may require that the skater should skate to standard. The competitor will be given the opportunity to withdraw or skate, as preferred. Any competition affected will be notified within 1 week of the closing date.
8. The draw will take place on Saturday, 6th February 2010 at 600pm at the Leisure Centre.
9. All music must be on CD. All programme music should be clearly marked with the name of the competitor and competition. There should only be 1 piece of music on the CD.
10. Winners shall sign for the trophy and retain them for 11 months or upon request (whichever is the earlier) after which it is their responsibility to ensure their safe return.
11. **Closing date for all entries is JANUARY 9th 2010.** Please note late entries will not be accepted under any circumstances.
12. Please enclosed a stamped self-addressed envelope.

TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS FOR NATIONAL SINGLES & PAIRS OPEN COMPETITIONS
FROM 1st JULY 2009 to 30th JUNE 2010

These competition program requirements fit with the National Test Structure requirements despite there being specification of elements in the test structure. The only amendment to the criteria from last season is the maximum number of elements in the beginner sections. As with the current test structure, all elements performed are as per ISU current regulations. This therefore allows skaters to perform RJS test and competition elements as per the established criteria (ISU regulations 2008) and indeed as per the IJS criteria and clarifications. (Communication 1504).

These Generic Criteria must be read in conjunction with the ISU Regulations 2008, any subsequent ISU communications, including the communication regarding listed jumps, and also the updated NISA IJS element clarifications (2/09) for RJS competitions and National tests available on the NISA website. (see Figure – Singles & Pairs – rules & regulations)

Ladies and Men may not compete together in the same singles competitions. These singles competitions must be split into separate Ladies and Men's events. This does not apply to exhibition events where this is at the discretion of the club. In levels 7 to 10 skaters may not compete in more than 1 level at National Open events or NISA Cup events. Tests passed after the closing date **DO NOT** allow entry to be transferred to another level under any circumstances.
